Support Youth Missions Through Sponsor Boards

This year's Mission Blitz is approaching faster than ever. Our students have raised much of the money for these trips themselves, but also depend on the support of this congregation to fulfill the financial burden of these trips. The last major fundraiser before our trips is the Mission Sponsor Boards.

The sponsor boards allow everyone from the church to support the youth missions fund to help alleviate the cost of the mission trip to our students. The goal for this year's sponsor boards is to offset our travel costs to Tennessee and to San Marcos. We will rent ten vans and drive more than 2,000 miles. The cost of renting vans, plus the cost of gas will exceed \$14,000! Please consider five or ten of our 2,000 miles so that we can make it to our mission destinations.

We have a long way to go and the trips are only a few weeks away, so come by the Sponsor Boards in the Fellowship Hall on Sunday!

Our senior high students will be working with the Tennessee Conference of the



In 2010, our students were in mission in Lake Charles, La., San Marcos, and Guatemala.

United Methodist Church to do flood recovery work. Last summer, Nashville and the surrounding areas were devastated by record floods. We will be assisting in the rebuilding efforts as they work to recover from those storms.

Another group of senior high students will be traveling to San Antonio, Guatemala, to work with Salud y Paz. We will help construct additions to a clinic and school that help Salud y Paz with its mission to serve the poor and indigenous communities of Guatemala.

Junior high students are headed to San Marcos to be



in mission with the poor and elderly of the community. The youth will be working with Southside Community Center, an outreach of the United Methodist Church.

Students will repair and rebuild homes for those who are unable to do so themselves.

The students will do hands-on mission, working with hammers and paintbrushes to spread the love of God in the San Marcos community. Last year students were able to learn how to use power tools in a safe and efficient manner, and were given valuable lessons by trained professionals on how to

do home repair.

On these mission trips, our students are taught valuable skills that will serve them in later life. They are also able to meet and spend time with the owners of the homes they are working on, and are able to hear their stories and share God's love with them.

These trips are an excellent way for our youth to learn what it means to live, learn, and lead the way of Christ in the world. But we cannot do this without your help.

A Word from Our Pastor

What word comes to mind when you hear the word “stewardship”? My colleagues at the church offered: **giving ... responsibility ... caring ... faithfulness.** Each expresses a dimension of our stewardship as Christians, and reminds us that stewardship as Christians requires attention to how we care for God’s creation and for God’s children, the responsible use of our resources individually and corporately, and the acknowledgement that what we have is a sacred trust from God.

How do we choose to be good stewards? What are faithful ways to use our resources? Am I willing to trust that good and faithful outcomes are possible from my actions, my financial resources, and my life? What can I do to be a good steward? We often erroneously think

that the church only speaks of stewardship during a particular time of the year – that time when we focus on our giving commitments for the next year. In reality, as we pursue our ministry and mission together, abundant opportunities for stewardship present themselves.

The leadership and staff are always looking for ways to be effective stewards of our church’s resources. Recently, we decided to send giving statements electronically, resulting in an annual savings of \$10,000. While the significant savings was paramount in the Finance Committee’s mind, we also know that the care of creation was important as we move to “go paperless.” How can you help? **Please update your e-mail address to ensure that you receive your giving statement.**

With summer upon us, we are hearing more about Vacation Bible School and Music and Arts Camp for our children, and Youth Mission Trips for our students. VBS serves more than 300 children in our church and community. More than 150 volunteers commit to give their time for the week; in addition, many persons have been working for several months in planning and recruiting for VBS. During Music & Arts Camp, 125 children spend the week engaged in creative and performance arts to present a musical. Caring, sharing, and serving are hallmarks of stewardship. How can you help? **Give of yourself for one day, one week, or more, volunteering at VBS and/or Music & Arts Camp.**

More than 100 students and adults are preparing to serve others by being missionaries for First United Methodist Church this summer. They will travel to San Marcos, Nashville, and Guatemala. The cost for these trips is more than \$60,000. The students are responsible for much of the cost themselves; however, our church practice has been to support a student for one day of mission. Many of us give several days of mission support. Giving and serving are what students, volunteer adults, and members of the

congregation do together to live out their Christian faith in mission. How can you help? **Sponsor a student for one day or more by speaking with students at the Sponsor Boards in the Fellowship Hall.**

Mission Central First Sunday is the basic support First United Methodist Church provides for the food pantry at Mission Central. Mission Central is the largest supplier of food to families in the HEB area who are in need of help. Did you know that 1,500 cans of pasta will supply the pantry for only three months? There is a great demand for us to replenish the pantry and to care for people who are struggling in our community. The need in summer increases for families with children, as they rely on schools to provide breakfast and lunch during the school year. How can you help? **Bring several cans of canned pasta on Sunday, June 5.**

Stewardship is a lifestyle of faithfulness, responsibility, generous giving, serving people who have needs, caring about God’s creation, and God’s children. **There are many opportunities for us to be good stewards – how will you help?**

FUMC Hurst to Provide E-Statements Beginning in July

In April the Finance Committee unanimously voted to implement a new giving statement policy. Currently monthly giving statements are mailed.

Beginning in July, FUMC Hurst will email monthly giving statements to all members with email access. Other members will continue to receive a monthly mailed statement.

E-Statements provide many benefits to our church, as well as church members:

- Cost savings to the church could amount to more



than \$10,000 per year.

- Help to make us good stewards of our world as directed by our own UMC Social Principle.

- Members will have the

ability to save a copy of their statement on their home computer for future reference.

- Confidentiality: E-Statements will not be seen or handled by other people.

To update your email address in our records, please send a message to Beckie Bright at bbright@fumchurst.org. Indicate your preference for email statements, and provide the primary email address you would like to use for church emails.

You can also update your address online. Go to www.fumchurst.org and click the box titled "E-Statements." Fill in the linked form with your name and preferred email address and click "submit."

In the coming weeks, you will be given several

opportunities to let the church know of your preference for receiving giving statements.

Members who wish to continue to receive statements by mail may do so and no action is required from you.

We believe this new policy will make us better stewards of all of God's resources.

Reserve Your Spot Today for Day Trip to Passages Biblical Artifact Exhibition in OKC

Are you ready for a day trip?

Plan to travel with us to Oklahoma City where we'll see *Passages*, an exhibition of 300 rare Biblical artifacts.

If you read the last copy of the *Reporter*, which comes inside our church newspaper, you probably saw the article about these ancient treasures that will be at the Oklahoma Museum of Art during the summer and early fall.

The exhibit contains a number of the earliest printed texts, including a large portion of the Gutenberg Bible, the second-largest private collection of Dead Sea Scrolls, a beautifully hand-colored and gilded edition of Luther's German translation of the New Testament (pictured), and the earliest surviving New Testament found on recycled parchment.

We will leave at 8 a.m. on Wednesday, June 29, traveling in the comfort of a chartered bus, have lunch upon arrival, tour the exhibit, and arrive back in Hurst early in the evening.

Although each clean and comfortable motorcoach

Coat of Many Colors is the largest single revenue source for Mission Central. Having the ability to increase store hours will generate much needed financial resources as Mission Central seeks to increase several existing programs, including the Family Opportunities Program, increasing the number of times per year a family receives food, tutoring more children, and teaching more adults to read, speak English and pass the GED test at the Village Library.

Teddy Bear Drive: July

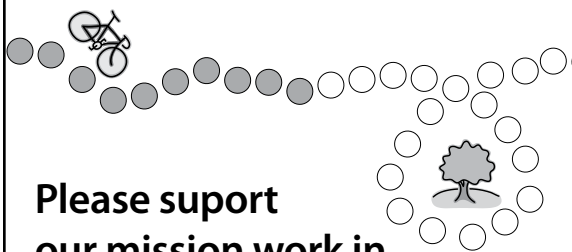
