## Sixth Graders Claim the Story of Jesus: Confirmation Sunday is May 15

On Sunday, May 15, First United Methodist Church of Hurst will celebrate the culmination of this year's Confirmation journey. We will welcome 29 Confirmands as they profess their faith in Jesus the Christ and promise to uphold this United Methodist Church with their prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness. This service will take place in 11 a.m.

worship, followed by a reception in the Fellowship Hall.

These sixth grade students began their journey in September and have learned about our Christian history and heritage, our life together in the church, our beliefs as Christians and as United Methodists, and our choice to live a life in Christ.

For some, this means making the choice to be baptized;

for others, it means choosing to affirm the faith into which they have already been baptized. For all, Confirmation has been an opportunity to participate in a faith community, including students, teachers, parents, and Faith Partners, which has helped them to claim the story of Jesus for themselves.

It has been a full year: Confirmands met weekly for

fellowship and learning, went on a retreat, listened to great speakers of other faiths, worshiped at Beth-el Congregation, worked and played with their Faith Partners, and participated in missions.

Soon these students will continue their faith journey as they become an important part of the Junior High Youth ministry!



# A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

A dozen people gathered in a circle in the front of the sanctuary after the last worship service on Palm Sunday. Together we shared Holy Communion, and I thanked them on your behalf for volunteering to celebrate Holy Communion with our homebound members. They visited 65 persons and brought a gift from the children of our church and a hyacinth. **I am grateful for volunteers.**

More than 100 people provided music on Easter Sunday in our three worship services. Many people greeted those arriving, ushered in one of the worship services, served as hosts at Coffee Fellowship, helped people by valet parking their cars, taught Sunday School, and folded and stuffed bulletins. **I am grateful for volunteers.**

Over a period of several weeks, a dedicated group of gardeners prepared raised beds for the Village Garden. They have planted and watered and tended the garden. Soon vegetables and herbs will be harvested for people who come to Mission Central needing help to feed their families. **I am grateful for volunteers.**

Dozens of persons from our church on the second Friday of each month unload a 55-foot trailer from the Tarrant Area Food Bank. As more than 300 people come through the line, they gather fresh produce, eggs, and juice, and greet and feed almost 1,100 families. **I am grateful for volunteers.**

Each Sunday morning, men and women greet children, shepherd them from place to place, tell a story, make a movie, or create an art project. They are teaching the stories of Jesus. **I am grateful for volunteers.**

Stories of persons volunteering in our congregation are endless. While we often refer to people who give their time as volunteers, they are more appropriately called servants. Each Sunday we renew a commitment to be faithful to Jesus the Christ through our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness. When a person volunteers, one is living into what it means to serve.

To choose to be a follower of Christ, one chooses to serve — to be a servant. What can you imagine yourself doing as a servant of Jesus Christ through the ministry and mission of First United Methodist Church? What do you sense God is calling you to do?

# Mission Central Update: 300+ Families Benefit Monthly from FUMC Food Donations

I continue to be amazed at the generosity of our congregation, and people in our community who care enough about our hungry neighbors to take action. In 2010, Mission Central's food pantry prepared grocery orders for an average of 250 families per month, which was a 30% increase from the year before. The upward trend seems to be continuing this year. So far, we are serving 300 or more families per month.

Our food pantry clients tell us regularly that the economy continues to hit them hard. People who used to work overtime are now working 30 hours per week; people who have been unemployed for a long time are no longer eligible for unemployment compensation; families who used to have two wage earners in the house are now trying to live

on one income. The elderly and disabled who are living on Social Security checks are seeing the cost of living go up while their income stays the same. And the saddest reality for the Mission Central Board of Directors, staff, and volunteers is that we limit the number of times families can come for food to three times per year, unless the client is disabled or on Social Security retirement and at the poverty level. This can change ONLY when our food supply goes up or additional funds become available to purchase food.

Currently, our food pantry shelves are stocked by donations (Boy Scouts, Christmas Providers, CUNA Mutual Group, individuals, North Pointe Baptist Church, Walmart, and our congregation) and a small \$10,800 budget. All of us at Mission Central are committed to doing a better job of communicating our needs for specific food items. For example, if we collected 1,300

jars of peanut butter and the same amount of jelly, we would have a four month supply of these items available for the 320 families we serve each month. The number is large – but so is the need. With knowledge about the need, we are hoping the congregation will follow the lead of the children who collected more than 2,424 boxes of macaroni and cheese. The May challenge is 1,300 jars of peanut butter and jelly!

In upcoming months, we will be sharing more of Mission Central's story. We are looking for opportunities to share our story with the community as well. If you are a member of an organization that would be willing to sponsor a food drive, please call me at 817.595.0011, to plan the timing of the food drive and the items to be collected.

Working together, we will continue to care for our hungry neighbors! Your involvement is greatly appreciated. We are truly blessed to be a part of a caring community of faith.
